Lane County's Homes for Good and NW Natural turn on reliable hot water for seniors and customers with disabilities



Homes for Good, the housing agency in Lane County, Oregon, owns 700 units of limited-income housing in the Eugene area. This winter, NW Natural helped

the agency replace a failing water heating system in a 150-unit building that is home to low-income seniors and people with disabilities.

"We are beyond grateful for our partnership with NW Natural," said Ela Kubok, Homes for Good's communications director. "Without it, we would have had to postpone other capital projects—like new roofs for some of our buildings."

When the centralized water heaters began to fail at Parkview Terrace, NW Natural was ready to help. Rick Hodges, NW Natural's energy-efficiency program manager, arranged for company engineers to assist with system planning. Then NW Natural covered the full cost to purchase and install new energy-efficient water heaters and upgrade the piping for water and natural gas.

This project was the first of its kind for NW Natural, which previously provided these services only to limited-income residents of single-family homes. Now we can help organizations



that—like Homes for Good—operate multifamily buildings for limited-income residents. We are eager to build similar partnerships.
